For five weeks in August and September 1997, I moved in with Chase and during that time got to spend a lot of time with Chase while she was filming the *DS9* episodes, "Favor The Bold" and "Sacrifice of Angels".

I arrived at Paramount late morning sometime during the last week of August during the filming of "Favor The Bold". Not knowing where Chase's trailer was, I sought out Russ, my favorite Paramount security guard, who escorted me to Chase's trailer. After putting my things in her trailer, I wandered over to the makeup trailer to say good morning to Chase (she'd left the house at 4:00am). Chase suggested we go for coffee, so we walked over to Stage 16 where the Promenade set is, went inside and got coffee. We meandered back to the makeup trailer and agreed to catch up to each other later as I did not have set clearance.

I visited some friends who work in other areas of the Lot, got lunch to go at the Paramount cafeteria and ate in Chase's trailer, and worked on some projects I brought with me. The Lot was busier than I'd ever seen it. I had to park in the pit where they filmed the water sequences in *Star Trek IV* and leave my keys with the Valet in case they had to move my car. Two major films were filiming on the Lot that week, Paramount's film *The Odd Couple 2* and Steven Spielberg's *Deep Impact*.

I ran into Jerry Rector (who's guest starred on TNG and Sliders) and mistook him for his twin Jeff. He was working on The Odd Couple 2. We chatted for a few minutes.

I went back to the *DS9* makeup trailer to check on Chase's progress. Karen Westerfield, Armin's makeup artist, was there, so we chatted for awhile. During our conversation, Kirkwood Smith stopped to say hi to Karen (they had worked together before) and I got to meet him. He was in full makeup for the alien he was playing in the *Voyager* episodes "The Year of Hell, Part 1 & 2".

Karen went back to work and I waited for Chase to get off set from rehearsing. Salome Jens walked by in full female shapeshifter makeup and wardrobe, so I said hello and told her how much I loved her work.

Max Grodenchik appeared and invited me in to the makeup trailer with him and we caught up with each other's lives. He introduced me to his makeup artist Karen Kroeker, who is married to DS9 director Allan Kroeker. Chase arrived to get touched up by Camille. I reminded Camille that Leeta needed her wandering mole, so she applied one on Chase's upper back.

Jeffrey Combs walked into the makeup trailer in full 'Weyoun' makeup. He looked amazing and extremely handsome and charismatic. I whispered for Chase to introduce me to him. She did. I was actually tongue tied because Jeffrey was so

amazingly handsome and impressive in full makeup. Out of the corner of my eye, I got to watch his makeup artist remove his makeup.

Chase and I then moved over to the Hair Trailer next door where Rebecca touched up Chase's hair. Rebecca also does Michael Dorn's and Terry Farrell's hair. After a few minutes, Jeffrey Combs came into the hair trailer to get his hair washed after removing all the makeup from his face and hair.

When Chase was finished in Hair, we went back to makeup for one last touch up. Allan Kroeker came in with his kids and said hello to everyone. He was on the Lot doing pre-production for when he would direct "Sacfice of Angels" the following week. Max was still around, getting his hand makeup touched up. At some point during the afternoon, both Armin Shimerman and Rene Auberjonois came into the makeup trailer and both said hello to me. At 3:25pm, Chase and Max were finally called to the set for their first filming of the day! At that point, I said my goodbyes to everyone and headed home.

The following week, Chase asked me to bring Jeremiah to the Lot while she was filming "Sacrifice of Angels". We arrived about 12:30pm and once again couldn't find Chase's trailer. I ran into the Assistant Director who told me Chase was on set. I once again enlisted Russ' help.

Russ insisted on taking us onto the Promenade set because Jeremiah was with me, even though I told him we did not have set clearance. He said it would be fine because Jeremiah was with me.

The cast and crew was getting ready to rehearse the scene where everyone is reunited on *DS9*. Since there was a lull, we got to greet Chase. Rene Auberjonois came up to say hello. Chase stopped Melanie Smith (Ziyal) and introduced her to us.

Allan Kroeker called for rehearsal and Jeremiah and I watched Chase, Terry Farrell (in full makeup and wardrobe), Colm Meaney (in jeans and a t-shirt), Alexander Siddig (in sweats), Avery Brooks (in casual clothes), Cirroc Lofton (in casual clothes), Michael Dorn (in full Worf makeup and hair, shorts and a polo shirt), J.G. Hertzler (in full Martok makeup and hair and casual clothes), Rene Auberjonois (in Odo hair and makeup and casual clothes), Andrew Robinson (in full Garak makeup/costume), Armin Shimerman (in full Quark makeup and partial costume), Max Grodenchik (in full makeup and partial wardrobe), Aron Eisenberg (in full makeup and partial costume) and tons of extras rehearse for 45 minutes. Lunch was called and everyone dispersed. Armin and Andrew came over and said hello and met Jeremiah.

Chase, Jeremiah and I walked to the cafeteria for lunch. On the way, we ran into Avery, who stopped and met Jeremiah. Chase left lunch early to get back to makeup for touchups. We met up with she and Max in makeup again, took photos before they had to begin shooting and said our goodbyes.

I returned to my car in the pit to find Levar Burton parked next to me, standing there talking to someone. It was an interesting way to end a star studded day!






